2021-2022 Budget Transfers

Scheduled for April 6, 2022

Five transfers are scheduled for consideration on April 6, 2022. The orders under consideration are attached and referenced by order number for your convenience.

Budget Order 2022-44 Corrections Assessment

The <u>Corrections Assessment Program</u> requires a Transfer of Appropriation to appropriate funding not known at the adoption of the budget. This requires an increase in Materials & Services of \$30,000 and a decrease in Transfers Out of \$30,000.

Budget Order 2022-45 HUMAN SERVICES: Alcohol and Drug

The <u>Alcohol and Drug Program</u> requires a Transfer of Appropriation to appropriate funding not known at the adoption of the budget. This requires a decrease in Transfers In of \$30,000 and a decrease in Personnel Services of \$30,000.

Budget Order 2022-46 GIS: GIS Equipment Reserve

The <u>GIS Equipment Reserve Program</u> requires a Transfer of Appropriation to appropriate funding not known at the adoption of the budget. This requires an increase in Materials & Services of \$6,000 and a decrease in Capital Outlay of \$6,000.
