ORS 255.295 Preparing abstract; notification of results. (1) Not later than the 27<sup>th</sup> day after the date of an election, the county clerk shall prepare an **ABSTRACT** of the votes and deliver it to the district elections authority. Not later than the **45<sup>th</sup> day** after receiving the abstract the district elections authority shall determine from it the result of the election.

(2) Subject to ORS 254.548, the election official may issue a certificate of election only after the district elections authority has notified the elections officer in writing of the result of the election. Your letter of acceptance need only state that you have accepted the election results, a statement indicating whether any candidate elected to district office is qualified to hold the office, the date of the election, your districts address and the signature of the district official sending the letter.

WHEREAS the voters in Umatilla County adopted a home rule charter in 1992, which was implemented January 1, 1993;

WHEREAS the Umatilla County Home Rule Charter provides that every four years, the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint a Charter Review Committee of not less than five citizen members whose purpose shall be to review the Home Rule Charter and its operation;

WHEREAS the 2023 Umatilla County Charter Review Committee submitted its report, which included two recommendations for changes to the Umatilla County Charter, including residency requirement for Sheriff;

WHEREAS on August 16, 2023, pursuant to the Umatilla County Charter, the Board of Commissioners considered the recommended changes by the Umatilla County Charter Review Committee, and adopted Ordinance No. 2023-07 referring the recommended change for residency to the voters for consideration.

WHEREAS on May 21, 2024, the electors of Umatilla County voted in favor of the charter amendment, Ballot Measure 30-164, 11,145 to 1,071.

NOW, THEREFORE the Board of Commissioners of Umatilla County ordains the adoption of the following amendment to Article IV of the Umatilla County Charter:

#### Section 2. Sheriff's Office

- (1) The Sheriff's Office shall have the functions of the sheriff as set out in Oregon law, except the functions regarding the collection of taxes.
- (2) The Sheriff shall have charge of the Sheriff's Office. The term of office for Sheriff shall be four years. The office of Sheriff shall be non-partisan.

- (3) Any candidate for office of sheriff shall present to the county elections officer a written certification from the Oregon Board of Public Safety Standards and Training showing that the candidate meets the following qualifications:
  - (a) Is citizen of the United States of America at least 21 years of age;
  - (b) Has had at least four years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer or at least two years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer with at least two years' post high school education; and
  - (c) Has not been convicted of a felony or of any other crime that would prevent the candidate from being certified as a police officer under ORS 181.610 to 181.670.
- (4) A person must be a resident of Umatilla County to hold the position of sheriff.

WHEREAS the voters in Umatilla County adopted a home rule charter in 1992, which was implemented January 1, 1993;

WHEREAS the Umatilla County Home Rule Charter provides that every four years, the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint a Charter Review Committee of not less than five citizen members whose purpose shall be to review the Home Rule Charter and its operation;

WHEREAS the 2023 Umatilla County Charter Review Committee submitted its report, which included two recommendations for changes to the Umatilla County Charter, including minimum age requirement for Sheriff;

WHEREAS on August 16, 2023, pursuant to the Umatilla County Charter, the Board of Commissioners considered the recommended changes by the Umatilla County Charter Review Committee, and adopted Ordinance No. 2023-06 referring the recommended change for minimum age to the voters for consideration.

WHEREAS on May 21, 2024, the electors of Umatilla County voted in favor of the charter amendment, Ballot Measure 30-165, 9,977 to 2,243.

NOW, THEREFORE the Board of Commissioners of Umatilla County ordains the adoption of the following amendment to Article IV of the Umatilla County Charter:

#### Section 2. Sheriff's Office

- (1) The Sheriff's Office shall have the functions of the sheriff as set out in Oregon law, except the functions regarding the collection of taxes.
- (2) The Sheriff shall have charge of the Sheriff's Office. The term of office for Sheriff shall be four years. The office of Sheriff shall be non-partisan.

- (3) Any candidate for office of sheriff shall present to the county elections officer a written certification from the Oregon Board of Public Safety Standards and Training showing that the candidate meets the following qualifications:
  - (a) Is a citizen of the United States of America and is at least 25 <del>21</del> years of age
  - (b) Has had at least four years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer or at least two years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer with at least two years' post high school education; and
  - (c) Has not been convicted of a felony or of any other crime that would prevent the candidate from being certified as a police officer under ORS 181.610 to 181.670.
- (4) A person must be a resident of Umatilla County to hold the position of sheriff.
