In the Matter of Viewing, Surveying and Laying out Road  
Survey No. 440, for Umatilla County, Oregon.

Commencing at a horn stake three inches (3) in diameter marked R. about one hundred and eighteen feet (118 ft.) North Easterly from North end of County bridge on the North fork of Walla Walla River in Township five (5) north of Range Thirty-Six (36) E. W. M. and running thence as near as practicable along the present traveled road up the said North fork of Walla Walla River to intersect the line between Section thirty (30) and Section twenty-nine (29) in Township five (5) North Range Thirty-Seven (37) E. W. M. Said road to be 40 feet wide.

## Viewers Report.

In the County Court for Umatilla County, State of Oregon  
In the Matter of the Petition  
of Jeff Kelly and others for the  
establishment of a County Road

To the Honorable County Court above named;

We, the undersigned viewers, appointed by the Honorable Court to view, survey and lay out a County Road as prayed for in the petition of Jeff Kelly and others, beg leave to report:

That pursuant to said order we met at Bartlett's Hotel, in Milton, Or., on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of June, 1894, at the hour of 8 o'clock, a.m., of said day, the same being the time and place fixed by said order for the meeting of the undersigned viewers and Jno. C. Arnold, Sur., per H. M. Reiter, Dptly Surveyor, appointed to survey said road, and after first taking an oath faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties of our appointment, we took to our assistance J. S. Frazier and W<sup>m</sup> Talbert as chain bearers and as marker and proceeded to view, survey and lay out said road as prayed for in said petition, as near as in our opinion a good road can be made at reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public, if such road shall be established and opened.

The said Jno. C. Arnold, sur., per H. M. Reiter, Dptly Surveyor, surveyed said road under our directions, and the same was conspicuously marked throughout, the corners and distances thereon noted, and all trees on the line of said road were marked on each of the sides thereof corresponding with the direction of said road with three notches cut through the bark and one inch into the wood, and all trees adjacent to the said line of said road were plainly blazed on the side facing said road. The beginning and termination of said road and the termination of each mile and intermediate points have been

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marked in the manner provided by law, as will more fully appear by the certified return of said Surveyor of said Road, which is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

That in our opinion the said proposed road should be established for the following reasons:

1<sup>st</sup>. The road is much needed for an outlet to residents along the North fork of the Walla Walla river.

2<sup>d</sup>. A good road is built and maintained within limits of the survey.

I meet A. M. Claw, Geo. Destaven and H. L. Frazier, viewers appointed on Road Survey No. 440, at Bartlett's Hotel, in Milton, Oregon, at 8 a.m. June 23<sup>d</sup>, 1894, and each qualifies as directed by law, J. L. Frazier and W<sup>m</sup> Talbert qualify as chainbearers, after which under direction of said viewers, I set a fir post 4 ins sq and 4 ft long, 18 ins in ground, for initial post in road No. 440, post properly mtd, and set in mid of stone 4 feet base and 18 ins high,  $832^{\circ} 11' 15''$  dist from a worn slate 3 ins in dia. marked Ron E.


