

In the Matter of county road petitioned
for by R P Pike at al, com at $\frac{1}{4}$ cor
bet secs 21 and 22 T 5 N R 29 E W M

ROAD No. 716

Now on this day this matter comes on for the consideration upon the petition of R P Pike and 14 other freeholders and residents of the road district or districts through which said proposed road is to be established, praying this court to establish a county road as follows:

Commencing at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec corner between section 21 and 22 T 5 N R 29 E W M, thence west on $\frac{1}{4}$ sec line 6 miles to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec corner between section 21 and 22 T 5 N R 28 E W M thence west through said last named section 21 on $\frac{1}{4}$ sec line to the east line or right of way of Huntington line of O W R & N Co railroad and there terminating, said road to be 40 feet wide.

And it duly appearing to the court from the affidavits of R T Brown and D C Brown filed herein, that due notice of the presentation of said petition has been given by the posting of three notices in the vicinity of said proposed road and one on the bulletin board at the north door of the county court house, that all of said notices were posted in a public place and in plain view of the public and remained so posted for the full period of thirty days previous to the presentation of said petition.

And it further appearing to the court that said petition is signed by more than 12 freeholders of the road district or districts through which said proposed road is to be established, and that there is no remonstrance or other objection on file against said petition, and the court being advised,

It is ordered that said petition be granted, and that the board of county road viewers, to-wit: Geary Kimbrell, as surveyor, and L C Rothrock and W J Stockman, as viewers, be and they are hereby instructed to meet at the commencement point on said road on the 24th day of May, 1911, or if unable to meet on that day the within five days thereafter and proceed to view, survey, stake, layout and estimate the cost of opening said proposed road and make due report thereof to this court on the first day of its next regular term.

In the Matter of Opening
of
County Road No. 700

Now on this day this cause comes on upon the report of the board of county road viewers heretofore instructed at the April, 1911, term of this court to view, survey, stake and report upon the cost of opening said proposed road No. 700 coming on for final hearing.

And it duly appearing to the court that the report of said viewers together with the plat and field notes are on file herein and that said plat and field notes are signed by the surveyor appointed to survey the same, and the said report having been publicly read on three different days of the same term of court, and there being no objections on file against said report.

And it further appearing to the court that the board of viewers has estimated the damages accruing by reason of opening said road Jas A Fee as \$500.00 and it appearing to the court that said road is of sufficient public utility and of need by the general public of Umatilla county and that the county should pay said damages so awarded to said Jas A Fee, and the court being fully advised,

It is therefore considered and ordered that said report be and the same is hereby accepted and the plat and field notes shall be recorded in the book of plats and field notes of Umatilla county, and that the county clerk be and he is hereby instructed to draw warrant in favor of said Jas A Fee in the sum of \$500.00 in full payment of damages sustained by reason of opening said road and that the road supervisor through whose district said road is to be established be and he is hereby instructed to open the same and put same in use for public travel.

In the Matter of Opening
