Description of corner evidence found:

3" brass cap on 2 1/2" I. pipe set in mound of stone, from which:

A 33" P. Pine Snag bears S43°W 117.9 ft. dist. tagged N38°E 176 lk dist (old BT) open blaze.

A 45" Fir Stump bears N1°W 139.4 ft. dist. 60°Visible scribing: (old BTs)

Fir bears N4°W 166.3 ft. dist. tagged S3°E 252 lk dist. - recent scribe

A 18" Fir bears S35½°W 149.7 ft. dist. tagged N36°E 227½ lk dist. = recent scribe.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set steel fence post, with 54-4 sign on section line near corner.

Painted blaze faces and 6" band around bearing trees red. Tagged trees with 54-3 & 4 signs where

Used steel tape and magnetic compass 19 3/4° East declination. Measured to the center of the bearing trees.

The corner was maintained September 23, 1982.

## History of 1977 BLM Remonumentation - (From BLM Field Notes)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 27 and 34, monumented with the original unmarked basalt stone,  $14 \times 10 \times 5$  ins., firmly set 4 ins. in the ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A sawed Pine Stump, 45 ins. diam., bears North, 212 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A decayed Pine Snag, size indeterminate, bears S.  $43\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W., 178 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze. (Record, S. 38° W., 176 lks.)
