The magnetic bearing of the true meridian at 7 a.m. is  $N. 78^{\circ} - 41' W.$ ; the angle thus determined, being reduced by the table, page 100<sup>of Meridian</sup>, gives the mean mag-decl.  $18^{\circ} 36' E.$

June 21<sup>st</sup> 1895

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The Cor. to T. 1 N. R. 35 and 36<sup>E.</sup> on Base line is a post marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. Thence I run North bet. secs. 31 and 36; and at 40.10 chs. full 5 lks. west of  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. and at 80.11 chs. full 4 lks. east of cor. to secs. 25, 36, 30 and 31; therefore this line bears N.

From the N. Cor. I run West on S. Bdy. of sec. 36; at 40.01<sup>chs.</sup> intersect  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., and at 80.03 intersect the cor. to secs. 35 and 36; therefore the base line bears W.

Therefore the bearings are as stated by the Surveyor General, and my chaining practically agrees with the field notes of the original surveys.
