CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the south boundary of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and subdivisional lines, and the subdivision of sections 29, 33, 34, and 35, township 2 south, range 34 east, Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

The history of surveys pertaining to this resurvey is as follows:

In 1887 James P. Currin and James E. Noland, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, surveyed the Umatilla Indian Reservation Boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines.

In 1917 Lincoln E. Wilkes, U. S. Surveyor, resurveyed a portion of the Umatilla Indian Reservation Boundary, a portion of the north and east boundaries and subdivisional lines, and completed the subdivision of the township.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions dated August 22, 1986, under Group No. 1343, Oregon.

Preliminary to the resurvey, the lines of the original survey were retraced and search was made for all corners and other calls of the record. Identified original corners were remonumented in their original positions. Lost corners were reestablished and remonumented at proportionate position based on the official record. The retracement data were thoroughly verified and only the true line field notes are given herein.

The directions of the lines were determined by deflections from azimuths obtained by direct solar observations and refer to the true meridian. All lines not forming a closure were measured twice.

Detectable Electronically Energized Particles (DEEP-1 TM) were buried as memorials at certain corner monuments. The DEEP-1 is composed of strontium encased in a color coded plastic container. The units are 1 inch in diameter, $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches long, weigh $2\frac{1}{2}$ ounces, and are magnetically detectable to an average depth of 8 feet.

The geographic position (NAD 1927) of the N 1/16 section corner of sections 20 and 21, as determined from a tie to United States Coast and Geodetic Survey triangulation station "PINE," located at the top of Storm Mountain in section 6 of this township, is as follows:



GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The portion of the township covered by this survey is located in the foothills of the Blue Mountains in Umatilla and Union Counties, 18 to 24 miles southeast of the town of Pendleton, Oregon. The elevations range from 4000 feet above sea level in section 33, to 4460 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 16, 17, 20, and 21.

The township is reached by way of U. S. Highway No. 395 south out of Pendleton, Oregon, to Pilot Rock, Oregon, thence southeast on East Birch Creek Road to the west boundary of the township. From there numerous gravelled and dirt roads provide access to the interior of the township.

The area resurveyed consists of rolling hills to steep slopes along the south boundary of the Umatilla Indian Reservation. The undergrowth is light and consists mainly of sagebrush.

There are several ranches and vacation homes in the creek bottoms and around Indian Lake Reservoir.

The mean magnetic declination is 19° East, as shown on the United States Geological Survey quadrangle "BALLY MOUNTAIN, OREG.," 7½ minute series, dated 1967.
