Chains: on the 'dest. cor.; and determine a true meridian by the solar at the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31^{2d} & 32, which agrees with the observation made at this point August 23. Thence I run

N. $89^{\circ} 44' W.$, on a random line bet. secs. 30^{2d} & 31.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

81.79 Intersect W. bdy. of Tp. 2 chs. 10 lbs. S. $1^{\circ} 42' E.$ of the cor. of secs. 25^{2d} & 36, which point I determine by the one remaining witness-tree, a fir, 8 ins. diam., bearing N. $20^{\circ} W.$, 56 lbs. dist., from old mound of stone^{2d} marked as described by the surveyor-general; the cor. stone is missing.

I re-establish this sec. cor. by setting an iron stone $15 \times 10 \times 6$ ins. 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25^{2d} & 36, marked with 5 notches on N. and 1 notch on S. edges, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. Pit impracticable.

I send herewith guide maps for Tps. 2nd & 3rd N., Rs. 37th & 48th E. I discover the following omissions in notes of T. 3 N., R. 37 E.: On west boundary of sec. 19, at 54.80 chs., trail up creek, bears with stream; N. 0° 2' W., bet. sec. 21st & 22nd, at 2.00 chs., trail from Greaves' Butte, bears N.W. & S.E. - then N.E.; N. 0° 3' W., bet. sec. 28th & 29th, at 45.50 chs. trail, bears N.E. & S.W. And in T. 2 N., R. 48 E., on line S. 89° 54' W., bet. sec. 11th & 14th, I find trail down hollow - at 18.50 chs. is omitted. All these trails were rattled, faded & dim at the points mentioned which accounts for the failure of the chain bears to notice them; they are now recalled by me & set down correctly on the accompanying maps.
