its original position, lying
in plowed ground, marked
S. 19. T. 4 N. on N. E. S. 30 R.
35 E. S. E. S. 25- R 34 E
S. N. S. 24 on N. N. face.
with 2 notches on S and 4 notches on N edge.
I reset cor at its
original position. ✓

The meander cor bet. secs 19 & 24 & pit was
originally set on an island just S of creek
I find the island mostly gone. with the pit
and cor. ^{entirely obliterated} not possible to set one in place.
