27.00	Bottom of gulch about 500 ft. below ridge. A brook, 3
	lks. wide, runs N.E.
	Leave timber and ascend hill.
40.00	Set temporary 1/4 sec. cor.
47.00	Top of ridge about 500 ft. above brook, course N.E.
	Enter timber and descend.
