A pine, 36 ins. diam., brs. S.82°30'E., 72 lks. dist.,
marked C.C., T.2 S., R.35 E., S.7, B.T.

The Closing Cor. of that portion of Secs. 6 & 7, within
the original Umatilla Indian Reservation, brs. S.17°16'
W., 6.95 chs. dist.

Land; rolling bench.

Soil; light shallow loam on basalt, 2nd rate.

Timber; pine, fir & tamarack.

Undergrowth; balsam, willow, pine & arrowwood.

At the Cor. to Secs. 17, 18, 19 & 20, the Lat. is 45°23½'N.,
long. 118°27'W., mag. decl. 19°30'E.

Note:

Due to an insufficient supply of iron posts for this
work & not wishing to cause the additional expense & delay
in securing a new shipment, I have monumented some of these
Cors. with stones.

General Description.

This portion of the Tp. lies W. & near the summit of the
Blue Mts.

The soil is light volcanic ash, very shallow over basalt
and affords good grazing.

It is nearly all timbered with yellow & lodgepole pine &
fir of little commercial value.

There are settlers in Secs. 6, 7, & 18.
